
How to Measure Your Space




A rough drawing of your space is useful and will help us with the design process. See below for a sample floor plan. Once you have dimensions and a basic sketch of your space, transfer the information to the grid on the next page of this guide. Here are some helpful hints to get you started.

Tips for Measuring Your Space

- Use a pencil to facilitate easy changes
- Measure in inches only
- Be sure to note all fixtures and utilities (with dimensions)
- Also note all electrical outlets/switches (with dimensions)
- Include location and size of windows and doors
- Note the size and location of existing appliances
- Indicate which way doors swing and into what rooms
- Breaks in walls and obstructions should also be noted
- Denote ceiling height and indicate any transitions, soffits and/or vents





How to Measure Windows and Doors

Measure each door and window and record in the grid below. Measurements should be from the outside edges of the window/door – trim to trim. All dimensions should be in inches.




Floor Plan
